Kennedy TT - 20 & 40K

Tonight 20 riders rode the 40 km. Test ITT at Kennedy Road. The course was out and back with each leg 10km. long. Some riders stopped at 20 km, and I don't blame them. It was hot, 30C, with a very strong southeast wind designed to slow the riders down on the return to the start line. Consequently there are 2 sets of results for the TT, those who did 20 km., and those who did 40 km. Lap times may be found on the Webscorer website.

In the 20 km. category, Jack Sasseville came in at 31:23 followed by Ken McDermid, and Elmore Brenton. Victor, our mercurial membership secretary came in fourth in his second TT. I rode in the early afternoon, and lost 5 minutes on the return leg, so I have work to do to justify my TT bike. The 40 km. podium consisted of Brian Kelly in a scintillating 55:49.8, followed by the fastest lady, Paolina Allan, who, it is certified, broke the hour at 59:35, with Shawn Wilcox's winning streak ending up in 3d place at 59:37. Shawn overshot the finish line on the first lap which might have contributed to his shocking demise.

This will be the final TT at Kennedy as Paolina's favourite road will soon be under construction at the end of this month. The exact date is unknown, however the Thursday night rides might get a few more rides until early August before the road is pulverized. The pavement will be 2 layers of chip and seal which will make for a rough surface next year. You do not want to crash on it as it will give you the road rash that you will never forget. It takes a year to become a smooth surface. We are looking for another circuit to replace the events scheduled at Kennedy in August, stay tuned for updates.

A big thank you to Sarah Grimes for doing a stellar job of timing, Neil Hendry at the turn, and me spotting and setting up.
