2023 Newmarket Eagles Cycling Club AGM Minutes (VIA Zoom)

Wednesday January 24, 2024 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm

There were 29 participants in the meeting. Special thanks to all attendees to make quorum!

2023 Season Recap by Ron Rehel:

- 1) Membership is similar to last year, but ridership is WAY up
- 2) Sunday cafe rides were very successful up to 35 riders on some rides
- 3) Long week-end rides were turned to destination rides and were very successful
- 4) OCA's Try-Out rides and mini socials were very popular

2023 Membership Demographics Michael Chong:

- 1) There were 195 members who signed up in 2023 compared to 188 last year (56 new members, 33% female)
- 2) Drop in 2020 due to COVID, a few members have moved away and NECC being a less race-oriented club than in the past. A question was asked if another reason for the membership decline is due to people switching to B1. Michael who is a member of B1 as well as the Eagles pointed out that while a few have switched, there are also many members of B1 who have newly joined the Eagles.
- 3) Hoping for good retention this year
- 4) Brief discussion about those who express interest when signing up but don't actually participate
- 5) For 2024, we increased the membership cost by \$4 to \$39 to eliminate TT costs and hopefully increase participation

Financials by Michael Chong:

1) We had revenue of \$11 260, and Expenses totalled \$9 611, resulting in a surplus this year of \$1 649. This was mainly due to a decrease in Race Team Travel/Subsidies. As a non-profit club, we strive to break-even. Most of the funds we receive are spent on events for the benefit of the members.

The OCA Tony Osborne Memorial Youth Cycling Fund by Andrew Darke:

The OCA will be doing more targeted fundraising this year, specifically for Youth programming and development, so the fund will be much more in the public eye than before, as they will also be using it to grant bursaries to clubs who are actively running or looking to start running youth specific programming, on top of grants to event organizers running youth categories.

Last year the OCA granted \$11,000 – so $11 \times \$1,000$ grants to event organizers who ran youth categories at their events. We raised a total of \$8,000 through our CCN registration system top up option for donating.

In addition, in 2022, the OC Board dissolved a Bingo restricted fund (\$31,000) and voted to move those funds over to the Tony Osborne Youth Development Fund – creating an even stronger base in which to run the granting program for clubs and event organizers.

There was a motion moved by Sarah, seconded by Bob, that the club donate annually to the Tony Osborne fund. The amount to be determined annually by the club financial situation. Motion carried.

eGal Report by Janis Nixon/Tracey Band:

The eGals now make up 33% of the club. There were regular Wednesday night and Saturday rides, and some participated in breakfast club rides Friday mornings. eGals use Slack to communicate and stay in touch. eGals participated in charity rides and also offered a Vino and Velo week-end in Owen Sound in August. It was a huge hit, and they are hoping to make it an annual event.

The eGals are planning to offer a bike maintenance clinic at a local bike shop, and plan to participate in Women's Ride Day in May and Mental Health in Motion ride on June 9.

TT Report by Bob Spencer

-There were several TT events but a record number were cancelled due to thunderstorms and forest fires in Quebec. For most of the season, there were 12 TT participants on average, mainly thanks to Paolina, who will receive a plaque for bringing so many participants to the TT's. The average dropped to 6 riders per TT in August due to the busy triathlon season.

Some clothing was donated, and Bob will sell it and donate the proceeds to Tony's fund.

There won't be pursuits in 2024 so we won't need the trophies any more. The volunteer award is going to John Blunsdon for his constant help at the TT's.

TT's will continue in 2024, on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

It was suggested that the Club calendar be updated to include charity rides and Mike's ride.

Race Team Report by Dan Lundenberg:

The Eagles Race Team had a very successful return to racing in 2023, racing with great distinction in multiple disciplines: road, track, cyclocross, gravel and mountain bike. The Eagles Race Team showed our sponsors logos at races throughout Ontario and upstate New York.

The Eagles Race Team earned many impressive palmarès in 2023:

- Mark Herbst won Gold at the Ontario Road Race Master D Provincial Championship.
- Mark Hopper won Gold in the Ontario Track Championships in the Master D Individual Pursuit, Scratch, Tempo and Points races.

The Eagles Race Team had many other great results, all of which are showcased on our Team's Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/NewmarketEaglesRaceTeam

In 2023, the Eagles Race Team relies on sponsors for support. We raised \$2,900 in sponsorships in 2023. Those who ride at least 5 races get back the cost of their 2023 Team Kit. We had nine Eagles who qualify for a kit reimbursement. The total amount of reimbursements in \$2,638. The Race Team spent \$100 in sponsoring a prime in a Youth Cup Race in London in 2023.

We have decided to forgo sponsorships in 2024 and future years. We should have \$2,642 in the Race Team Fund. We will use the remaining fund to reimburse racers who race 5 races in 2024.

Group Ride Report by Sarah Grimes:

- added new ride leaders this year, and held a great debrief session at the end of the year
- hoping to include eGals at all Try Out rides this year to ensure club is inclusive of all members
 - it was pointed out that some eGals may need a shorter ride option (~30 km)
 - Sarah proposed working together to find the best solution

There will be a meeting Saturday January 27 at 1:30 pm at Metropolis Café to discuss the overall idea of gravel rides, schedule and ideas for gravel routes that are for everyone.

The rides will get progressively harder and even though they are <u>not</u> intended to be hammer fests, they will be targeted at the stronger members of the club (particularly the Fall rides).




